Classroom Session

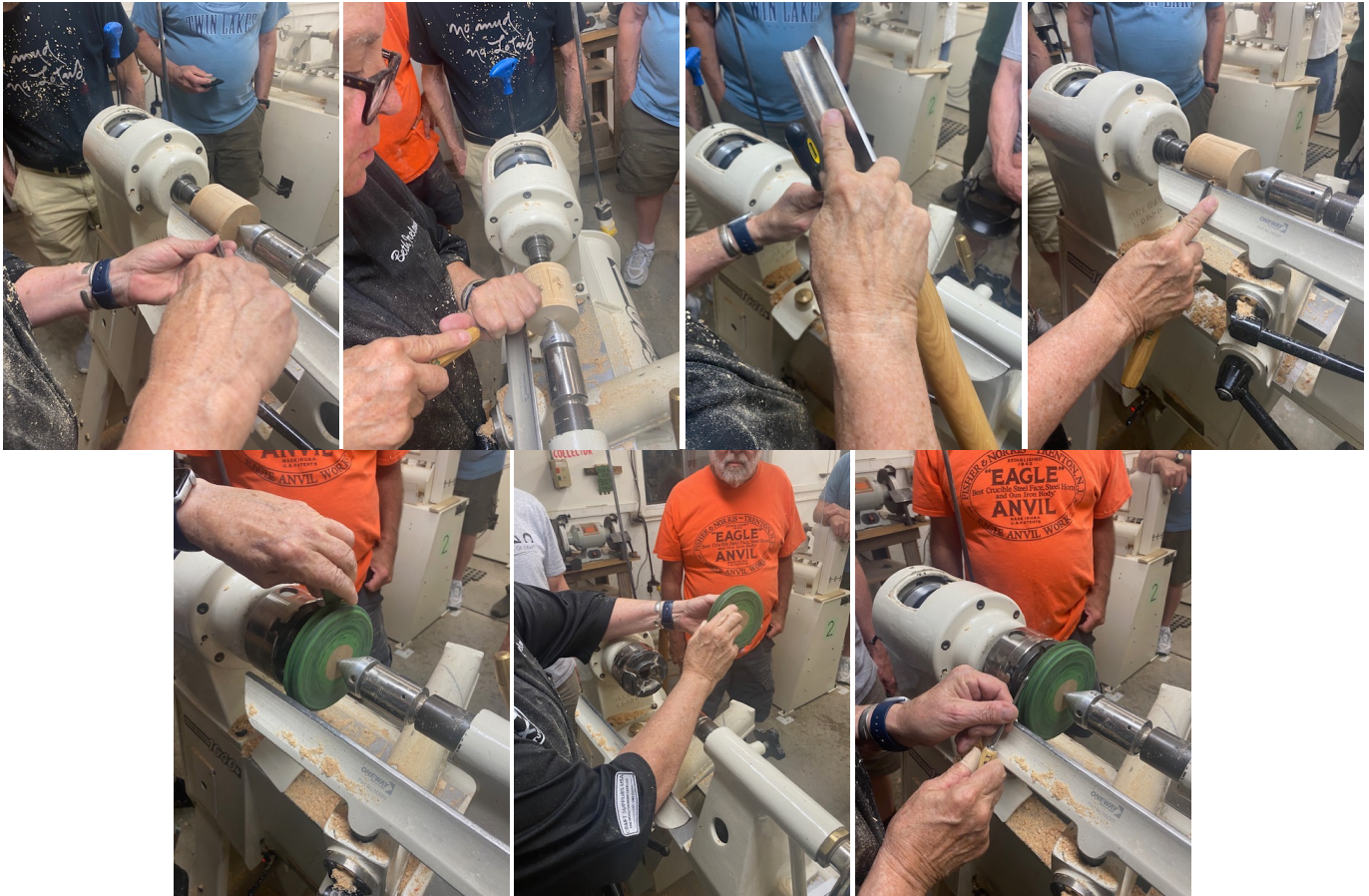
Ms. Ireland conducted a classroom session on turning a cylinder, carving a pattern into it then using the cylinder to make prints on cotton board stock. The following pictures depict the steps from turning a square basswood block to a finished print.



Some examples of member's work from the week long class which they attended.



The following pictures show Beth taking a basswood block and turning it into a cylinder employing a rouging gouge. She demonstrated how to grind the gouge and such a way as to allowing shear cuts to achieve a super smooth surface. She demonstrated how she sharpens her carving gouges prior to carving patterns into her cylinder.



Here members move to their respective lathes and practice turning a perfect cylinder.



After turning their cylinders, Beth demonstrated how to drill a hole in each end of the cylinder to accept a dowel as an axel. The dowels will allow the cylinder to be rotated without getting ink all over the artist's hands.

First ink is rolled on a medium. Then the cylinder is charged with the ink and the cylinder transfers the ink onto the cotton card stock to imprint the carved pattern.

Here we see several members making their own prints. The session was very successful and enjoyed by all.
